

# Frequently Asked Questions – Inclusion TV

## ***Can I bring more than one colleague?***

Places are limited on the course to 50 but if we know before the 28<sup>th</sup> February we may be able to accommodate an extra place. Our suggestion is to make a decision and register them as soon as possible to avoid disappointment.

## ***Who is the course for?***

Inclusion TV is for professionals who work with young people. They may have experience of inclusion projects international work, or both. One of the aims is to bring a wide range of different types of organisations together from around the country to develop a new network. Hopefully what will then come out of this is a number of partnership projects leading to new “Youth in Action” applications.

## ***What is the role of young people?***

Young people from 4 local schools will help run the technical aspects of the event. The TV station is just the vehicle for engaging professionals into discussions around inclusion. So throughout the event the TV station will be used to facilitate some fun activities, and afterwards our facilitators will help you draw out the learning and develop plans for future inclusion work.

## ***I'm thinking of bringing one of our volunteers who is 17 - what will they do?***

Young people will have a choice when they arrive, they can get involved in the full programme with the other professionals or if they want a different learning experience they can join our technical team. This will involve them capturing information from participants (photos, audio interviews and video) and blogging it to our facebook page, twitter and the website. So by the end of the event there will be a fun record of the journey participants have been on. This will be a little more active and involve less group discussion which some people prefer.

## ***Is this a training event?***

Unlike most training courses theoretical inputs will be as minimal as possible. People attending the course will have signed up because they have something to share or something to learn. From previous conferences we know this is what participants value most so we want to create an environment where this is possible. The event will be thought provoking and hopefully very engaging. It will encourage group interaction in an environment that will push you outside of your comfort zone.

***Will I have to be on camera?***

We will never force anyone to go on camera but some of your team challenges will involve you designing a 5 minute programme which is then presented on camera in front of others. This may be challenging but we will support your team to explore how you best do this. You and your team will then decide who goes on the camera.

***Will there be any other costs?***

The simple answer is – no! However if you require extra meals or drinks from the bar this will not be included.

***After I fill out the application form what do I do?***

Towards the end of February you will receive some joining instructions with all the information needed to get you to the venue in Sheffield. On arrival there will be a reception desk and further instructions will be given once you arrive. Please arrive in time for a 2pm start on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> March.

***What do I do about booking transport?***

Getting to Sheffield is being left to individual participants. Parking is available at the hotel for the duration of your stay and it is recommended if travelling by train to book early for the best deals. Momentum will refund up to £65 of your travel to the venue but you must keep booking information and all receipts, without these refunds cannot be made.

***What do I do about paying my fee?***

We will send you information about payment together with your joining instructions.

***I'm a little uncertain as I'm coming alone and don't know anyone, will I be ok?***

The Momentum team is very experienced at getting to know the group and getting people working together straight away. At the start of the conference there will be some teambuilding (don't worry it will be fun!). If you have any concerns speak to Alex on arrival and she will help you deal with them.

***How long are the days going to be?***

The beauty of any residential experience is the time you spend working together and getting to know new people so we always like to maximise the opportunities for this to take place. The days will start at around 9am and finish around 9pm. This will give time for some socialisation together afterwards.
